

GREYDEN'S ONLINE HORSE SHOW JULY 2020



Greyden coaches will host an entire week (held during lessons) where students will complete a given course and flat test (during their lesson) that will be judged for our “virtual” horse show. ALL students present in lessons will participate; those who pay the “entry fee” will be judged and considered for prizes. ALL Students will receive feedback after completion of courses and flat test from coaches (like they would at an actual horse show).

Proceeds will go directly to the farm, as we are hosting this as a fundraiser and an activity to replace the fact that our show season has been put on hold.

Competition Dates: July 13th- July 17th 2020. Judging will be conducted the following week.

PAYMENT & ENTRY:

- Entry fee: \$15 per rider (this is on top of the amount paid for their regular lesson)
- Payment: Fees can be e-transferred (no cash) to Marissa Mallais: marmallais@hotmail.com
 - Your payment will be considered as your entry: please include in the email your child / children’s names
 - If you are unable to use e-transfer please reach out to Marissa to arrange payment
 - Payment must be received by July 6th, 2020
- Prizes: There will be TWO winners for each level (levels or “divisions” are categorized as 5:00, 6:00, 7:00 and 8:00 riders, as per old lesson schedule)
 - 1st place will receive a FREE private lesson (\$50 value) with the coach of their choice, and a ribbon
 - 2nd place will receive a ribbon

SCHEDULE/RULES:

- Each level or division will have their own flat test, appropriate to their level of riding (given ahead of time) and a hunter course (given the day of lesson and competition) to complete.

- Even though competitors will be judged on different days, all riders considered in the same level will ride the same challenges and be entered in one big group. For example: all 6:00 level competitors will complete the same course and flat test and will be judged against each other.
- Coaches will videotape competitors who choose to enter and have paid the entry fee.
- Lessons on judging days will consist of proper warm up on the flat, warm-up over fences, and once over the entire course, just like at a horse show
 - Near the end of the flat warm-up of the lesson each student will complete their flat test
 - Near the end of the lesson, after proper warm-up, the students will complete their course
- There will be no excuses, or chances to re-do the course (as per same rules as a horse show)
- This will take place over one full week of lessons – if the rider has more than one lesson in one week, coaches will let that rider know when they will be filmed for competition.

JUDGING:

- Coaches will work together to judge each division and choose the top 3 riders from each level (competitors will not be aware of the top 3)
- Competitors will receive a score for their flat test, and a separate score for their hunter course. This will help coaches compare and pick 3 riders from each level (scores will not be valid for the outside sourced judge to make their decision)
- Top 3 students from each level will then be judged on the same course/flat test video by an outside source. The outside source/judge will choose 1st and 2nd place for each level.
